

The Qanuikkat Siqinirmiut (How are the people in the South?) health survey is a community-based participatory project that aims to describe the health and well-being of Siqinirmiut (southern Inuit). Our goal is to develop an understanding of health and well-being that is based in Inuit experience in order to effectively build the capacity to address community needs and support the development of Inuit-specific services.

The Southern Quebec Inuit Association (SQIA) was created to answer the needs of the growing population of Inuit outside of Inuit Nunangat, living mostly in Montreal. Our mission is to unite southern Quebec Inuit and assist in the communities' development by advocating for, promoting, preserving and celebrating our language, culture, traditions and way of life.

Since February 2018, SQIA has be the principal community partner and designated "knowledge user" for the Qanuikkat Siqinirmiut health survey.

What are Non-Insured Health Benefits (NIHB), often referred to as "N" number?

As in Inuk living in Quebec, you are eligible for the Quebec Health Insurance Plan. Many medical services, such as seeing a doctor, are covered by your health insurance card (RAMQ).

NIHB Program provides eligible Inuit with coverage for a specified range of medically necessary health-related goods and services when not covered through private insurance plans or provincial health and social programs.

Coverage includes prescription drugs, medical supplies and equipment, mental health counselling, dental care, vision care, and medical transportation.

All pharmacies are registered providers with Indigenous Services Canada, as well as many optometrists, but only a few dentists. Places that have not registered will ask you to pay upfront for their services, and you will have to ask for a reimbursement. Requests must be filled out using an NIHB Client Reimbursement Request Form (available at https://www.canada.ca/content/dam/hc-sc/migration/hc-sc/fniah-spnia/alt_formats/pdf/nihb-ssna/benefit-prestation/form-reimburse-rembourse2-eng.pdf) and received by the Program within one year from the date of service or purchase to be eligible for payment. Please note that NIHB does not cover everything, call them if you have any questions about coverage.
